

**ORANGEBURG PREP'S LOWER CAMPUS' SUPPLY LIST  
2010 — 2011**

**PRESCHOOL**

Supplies for preschoolers: Three 8 count packages of Crayola crayons, an eight count package of classic colored Crayola washable markers, a composition notebook, two large glue sticks, one package of No. 2 pencils, one bottle of Elmer's glue, two dry erase markers (black), two boxes of Kleenex tissues, two rolls of paper towels, two packages of anti-bacterial wipes, one box of seven ounce Dixie cups, one package of gallon sized Ziploc bags, one bag of cutlery (spoons, knives, forks), one roll-up mat which includes a pillow and blanket for rest time (these can be purchased from J. C. Penney and other stores), and one canvas tote bag with handles (no zippers). A tote bag is required in preschool (no book bags). Please bring your child's supplies to the Parent/Teacher Orientation.

**KINDERGARTEN**

Supplies for kindergarteners: two packs of **EIGHT COUNT PACKAGE OF CLASSIC CRAYOLA CRAYONS**, eight or ten count package of **CLASSIC CRAYOLA BROAD TIP MARKERS**, five glue sticks, one package of No. 2 pencils, one package of antibacterial wipes, one box of band-aids, two boxes of Kleenex tissues, one fine point dry erase marker (black/blue), one roll of paper towels, one container of Clorox wipes, one bottle of liquid antibacterial soap, one single subject notebook, one pink rubber hand pencil eraser, and one canvas tote bag with handles or a book bag. We prefer tote bags or book bags that the children can carry. Although wheeled book bags are allowed, they are bulky, hard to hang, and hazardous in the halls. Kindergarteners are not required to carry excessive weight to justify wheels. Additional items may be requested by individual teachers at the meeting with parents. Please bring your child's supplies to the "Meet the Teacher" on the Thursday before school starts.

**FIRST GRADE**

Supplies for first graders: Papermate pencils, erasers, scissors, eight glue sticks, a 12" ruler, three primary journals by Mead Stage 3 (space for picture and ruled lines), Crayola markers, a package of Expo dry erase markers, two boxes of crayons (8), a clip board, one container of Clorox wipes, one large box of Kleenex, a pencil box, two stretchy jumbo book covers, and one box of small envelopes (to be kept at home for sending money). Additional items may be requested by individual teachers at the first grade parents' meeting.

**SECOND GRADE**

Supplies for second graders: Scissors (Fiskar — blunt tip), two packages of regular No. 2 pencils, one box of Crayola crayons (16 count), a bottle of Elmer's glue, one glue stick, one package of non-permanent markers, two packages of wide-ruled notebook paper, two boxes of Clorox wipes, one box of Kleenex tissues, a box of sandwich size Ziploc bags, three stretchy jumbo book covers, and a clear plastic **shoebox** for storage. Please do not label items. We will not be using Trapper Keepers or 3-ring binders. Additional supplies may be requested by individual teachers.

**THIRD GRADE**

Supplies for third grade include: School box to store supplies, notebook—3-ring binder, notebook paper (wide ruled), one package of divider tabs, one 12" ruler with centimeters and inches, one highlighter (any color), a package of No. 2 pencils, three stretchy jumbo book covers, one package of rectangular hand erasers, one subject 70 sheet spiral notebook (wide-ruled) for a journal, two pocket folders (no prongs), one large package of red ball-point pens, two dry erase markers (black), one large box of Kleenex, scissors—plastic (not blunt point), crayons (24 count), markers (no Sharpies), two small glue sticks, and one container of wet wipes. Please label all items with child's name. Additional supplies may be requested by the individual third grade teachers.

#### **FOURTH GRADE**

Supplies for fourth grade include: Small assignment notebook, a zippered 3-ring binder notebook, a package of subject dividers labeled—Homework, Reading, Math, and Social Studies, one container of Clorox/Lysol wipes, hand sanitizer, notebook paper (wide ruled), one two-pocket folder without metal clips, one large box of Kleenex, a ruler (standard/metric), a box of crayons—any size, markers, two writing pens (any color), small scissors, a package of No. 2 pencils (please, no mechanical pencils), one glue stick, one subject spiral notebooks for science and spelling, one highlighter (any color), book covers, and a school box to store supplies. A blue or black dry erase marker is needed for music.

#### **FIFTH GRADE**

Supplies for fifth grade include: A zippered Trapper Keeper or velcro closure notebook with six pocket dividers, notebook paper (wide ruled), No. 2 pencils, red/blue/black ink pens, highlighters, one box of colored pencils, two glue sticks in a Ziploc bag, three large boxes of Kleenex, one bound composition book (9.75 x 7.5 in.) wide ruled to be used as a journal, scissors, book covers, one small container of Clorox wipes, one Mead or Pacon brand sketchbook for Science (spiral on the left side), 1-1/2" 3-ring binder (any color) for language and writing, five pocket tabbed dividers (will label in class), a zippered pouch, and two black dry erase markers. Please label all school supplies with student's name.

#### **ENRICHMENT CLASSES**

First through fifth grade students need a black dry erase marker with no names on them. They will be placed in a large container and will be used as they are needed. Fifth graders will be asked to bring money sometime during the first couple of months of school to purchase recorders to use in music. Not sure of the price (under \$10) as of this time; however, a note will be sent home at a later date. The Music teacher along with the Art teacher would also like to have a box of Kleenexes each if anyone would like to donate some.

Third through fifth grade students will need a folder for their Spanish classes.

All students first through fifth grade will need to bring a pack of No. 2 pencils for art. Fourth graders need a 3-ring binder and plastic sleeves to put their artwork in.

Fifth graders will need a 1" binder in order to create a sports notebook.
